

BORDERS HIDEAWAY HOLIDAY HOME PARK

ACCESSIBILITY STATEMENT

The purpose of this Accessibility Statement is to give an accurate description of the facilities at Borders Hideaway Holiday Home Park, bearing in mind people with various abilities. In the main, Borders Hideaway is best suited to reasonably ambulant users.

General - Borders Hideaway Holiday Home Park is situated in a valley above the sleepy village of Clyro, of which the famous Victorian diarist Frances Kilvert was the curate. Clyro itself is on the Welsh side of the river Wye just one mile away from Hay-on-Wye, "the town of books". We have kept a rural theme to Borders Hideaway by using stone walling all around our park, with most of the stone being excavated from the park itself, these are enhanced by the wide variety of native shrubs and plants. We have planted an orchard, which is stocked with a varied selection of native fruit trees, together with a fruit and nut hedge.

Holiday Homes - We sell new and used holiday homes that are for the use of caravan owners and their immediate family/friends, they are not available to rent, consequently they are adapted to meet the accessibility requirements of individual holiday home owners. All holiday homes are connected to mains electricity, water, drainage, gas and have access to BT services.

Touring/Camping Park Layout - Our super pitches which are located on two levels, are available with water, electricity and drainage, all with hard standings finished with gravel; these are mainly used by seasonal tourers from March 16th to October 15th. The camping field has 18 electric hook ups, with non electric pitches interspersed, free Wi-Fi access is available for tourers and campers and on a fee payment basis for seasonals. As there are some inclines on the road to the touring and camping areas, these facilities are best suited to ambulant users. The touring and camping pitches have all been specially landscaped so that they give a level area for caravans, motorhomes and tents. Motorhome pitches have level hard-standings. There is plenty of room for parking alongside tents and touring caravans.
